## A strategic partnership for the future of agrifood systems

The transformation of agrifood systems is not only urgent - it is inevitable. Ending hunger and malnutrition in all its forms, while contributing to climate action and addressing biodiversity loss and rising inequality demands a fundamental shift in how we collaborate and invest in agrifood systems.

To accelerate this shift, the International Chamber of Commerce (ICC) and the Hand-in-Hand (HIH) Initiative of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) are joining forces to promote new and innovative investments for agrifood systems transformation. Together we are launching the ICC-FAO Pathway to the Hand-in-Hand Initiative Investment Forum 2025: a unique series to raise awareness, promote dialogue, and co-create innovative, impactful solutions between the private sector and global institutions. The Pathway culminates in a high-level Private Sector Networking Reception co-hosted by ICC and FAO during the HIH Initiative Investment Forum 2025 at FAO headquarters in Rome, Italy during the World Food Forum (WFF).

The initiative welcomes companies across the agribusiness value chain - from emerging players to global leaders - committed to advancing the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) through responsible, sustainable, and inclusive investment.

## The Journey: Three key phases

## PHASE I - Online engagement session | 16 July 2025, 15:00-15:50 CEST

### Laying the groundwork for action

The ICC-FAO Pathway will open with a high-impact online session, designed to activate private sector leadership and lay the groundwork for strategic engagement in the lead-up to the WFF.

This session will explain the vision and objectives of the Pathway and present the exclusive opportunities available to businesses within the framework of the FAO HIH Initiative Investment Forum.

On this occasion, the ICC Recommendations for Effective Public-Private Partnerships in Agrifood Investment will be introduced. This document aims to outline key principles to foster impactful, inclusive, and resilient collaboration between the public and private sectors in agrifood. Attending companies will learn about its objectives and how they can contribute to its creation by sharing their experiences and insights.

The session will close with a forward-looking overview of the next steps and a dedicated space for participants to provide feedback and suggestions to shape the process ahead.

An additional session may be organized in September to present a selection of country investment plans. The scheduling of this session is currently under consideration.
